# **Results of the 2002 Gary Anderson Invitational Tournament**

The Gary Anderson Invitational Tournament was held over 3 days, Nov 8, 9, and 16, at the LTC Tommy G. Pool Range at Ft. Benning, Ga. As with past years, this tournament generated a large participation by high school teams from around the southeast. One team came all the way from Ohio this year. The tournament encompasses multiple competitions: 3x20 3-Position Air Rifle, International Standing Air Rifle, 3x40 Smallbore Rifle and Air Pistol. The 3-Position Air Rifle and the Standing Air Rifle have team events for 4-person teams. For Air Rifle events, both sporter and precision class competitions are held.

The winner in the Sporter Category receives the Gary Anderson Prize which consists or a Feinwerkbau P-70 Junior air rifle donated by the CMP, and various accoutrements donated by supporting vendors – Champion's Choice, CenterShot Sports, Pilkington Competitions and Creaestia Hall.

Not many were truly surprised at the strong showing by Woodward Academy's varsity team this year since the team vaulted from last year's win to finish with a 12-0 season and take the Georgia State High School Championship title in April 2002. However, the strength of the riflery program for both Woodward Academy and rival, Griffin High School, is in the number of medals taken by those two schools in the new shooter category. Of the 10 awards given, Woodward took four and Griffin three. They have successfully introduced many new athletes to the sport and trained them to a high level in just a few short months. All of these individuals began their competitive shooting training in September with the advent of the Georgia High School Association rifle season. While competitions begin in January, these two schools have been training daily since the first allowable day of practice. Both Woodward Academy and Griffin High School promise to be strong contenders for top honors in the Georgia High School competitions this season.

Part of the training regimen instituted by Woodward coach, Sidney Oliver, is to have regular practice matches once the new shooters have learned the basics of each position. This simulated match performance goes a long way towards preparing the new shooters for the mental stress of competition. While the GHSA matches are only 10 shots per position, the Gary Anderson match is 20 shots per position. There are certainly mental differences in how shooters prepare for the short match versus the longer match. The Woodward team had several 3x20 practice matches to help the team members make the mental adjustments to their shot pace and build their stamina for the longer match. The team also practiced getting into position on tables like those that were used at the range at Ft. Benning to help them understand the differences in positions, especially in prone where the table is narrower than the full width of the firing point. It also made them aware of the courtesy needed on the firing line when dismounting from tables so as not to disturb the shooters in the next lane.

Bogalusa High School has been a strong finisher in this match for many years, generally in the Sporter class. They were second in this class this year, but that was after three of the four members of last year's winning team had moved up to the Precision class where Bogalusa finished 5<sup>th</sup> and their top shooter, Brandon Green, took 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the individual Precision competition. In fact, Bogalusa took more awards than any other school in the tournament, claiming two trophies in the Sporter class standing air rifle event,.

For me, personally, I attended the GHSA community coach's program to allow me to continue to work with the Woodward team even though my son has graduated and gone on to shoot for the Air Force Academy rifle team this year. I try to go to two practices each week and work with the new shooters on their basic skills, general technical rules, and shooting etiquette. I continue to work with and support the Wolf Creek Young Shooters program that was started with Gary Anderson's assistance at the Wolf Creek Olympic Range after the Atlanta Olympics in 1996. Many of the parents of shooters in this club are very involved with the programs of their children at the respective high schools, and WCYSA has produced many top-notch shooters who have gone on to success in the college ranks.
